

Chie for a Cold or Cough

Take 3 pintes of raw milke & two blowes of garlick, & two poundes in eyle on handfull of organs & a little rose-mary, on ponders of hunny & boyle all these together untill on third part be consumed and give it to horse warme & fasting & Ride him a little and see let him stand this is said to be the best of all medicines for the

for a Cold or glanders, which is said to be the best of all for that also

Take a pint of white wine vinegar and put thereto a little groundswell and organs and shred them small, put the vinegar & herbs upon the Embers at night untill the morning a boiling warme all night & then put thereto on ounce of the powder of Clatompaine & on ponders of eyle & two new layd Eggs beaten & so give it to horse

How to save a horse from stringing of flies in Summer

Take some Rue & therewith rub him all over and knowe flies will touch him

for Dimness of sight, or Blindness

Take a pretty quantity of May butter with as much Rosemary, and a little yallow Sazon, with a little quantity of Belladine, then stamp them and fry them with the May butter, then strain it and keep it in a close box, for it is a Jewell for sore eyes, and anoint your horses eyes at least twice a day; it is also good to heal any wound

Take the shells of halfe dozen Eggs, and cleane away the inner film from them for cleane may be, then lay these shells between two cleane galls and so lay them in hot Embers and cover them all over & so let the good space till the shells be all dry, then beat them all to powder & searge it very fine, and so take a geese quill and blow it into the horses eye at morning Noon and Night.

to Cure the Virus

first Shave of the hair from the fowls place, and then lay upon it a plaister of Schoomakers wax, and remove it not till the fowls break, then remove the plaister and it will both heal and dry it

A Cure for the fistula

Take a pint of Strong vinegar and being hot upon the fire, mix therewith some hot wall being two lins in it, but by no means put not out the straw or hay that is therein, but boyl it together till it come to a salve; then being reasonably hot, spread it over all the fowls place & as far as you shall feel it hard, and shall thus doe twice aday, and it will not only ripen & break it, but also draw it out to the bottom & heal it, this also cures galls backs or knips places

for the fashions

Take Drag-worts or groundsel and beat it well in a mortar with white salt and then stop it hard into the horses ears and so either stick them together or tie them with a broad little strap, removing it in fourteen hours for three or four Dressing, and it heal any reasonable fashions

for the Buts

Give the horse two or three pipes full of tobacco in some oats and it will help him or drink him with it in some beer

for the Staggers

after the misadise blood him 2 or 3 times in the neck same.

Take Asafotida & having dissolved it in vinegar warm it upon a chafin dish of holes and with round balls of tow stuff it hard into the horses Ears and so give him up for 24 hours, then give him about table drink
