How to save a horse from stinging of flies in summer

take some Rue & thowith rub him all over and know flies will touch
him for dimess of sight, or blindnes
take a pretty Quantite of May Butter with as much Rosemary, and a littell
yellow Rason, with a littell quantity of Salladine, then stamp them and
fry them with q. May Butter, then strain it and keep it in a close box,
for it is a fowall for sore Eyes, and anoint your horses Eyes at least twice
aday; it is also good to heal any wound

take the sholls of halfe a dozen Eggs, and cleane away the innre film from
them soe cleane as may be, then lay these sholls betwix two cleantgob
and see lay them in hot Embers and cover them all over & see let them a good
spase till q. sholls be all dry, then coat them all to powder & boare it
very fine, and see take a goose quill and blow it into q. horses Eye at
morning noon and night.

first shave of q. hair from q. swold place, and then clap upon it a plaister of
sheemakers waxe, and remewe it not till q. swold broak, then remewe the plaister
and it will both heal and dry it;

A Cure for the fistula

Take a pint of strong vinges and boyle hot upon the fire, mix therewith
some old walle boing hore lime in it, but by no meaneys pat not out q. straw
or hay that is therin, but boyle it together till it come to a salwe, then
boing reasonably hot, spread it over all q. swold place & as far as you shall
feel it hard, and shall thus doe twice aday, and it will not only siper & broak
it, but also draw it out to q. bottom & heal it, this alſo draw gall backs
or blis places

for the fassions

Take Drag-worts on groundswoll and coat it well in a morter with white salt
and then stop it hard into the horses ears and see either stick them together
or tie them with a broad intelle strap, remewe it in fourtoon hours for
three or four dressing, and it heale any reasonable fassions

Give the horse two or three pipefulls of tobaccoe in fome eates and it will
help him or drinck him with it in fome boare
