made on double six penny stamp Parliament according to the late acts of Parliament the eighteenth day of November in the sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne by the grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith et cetera bond one thousand four hundred and seven **Betweene** John Lenthall of Burford in the County of Oxford Esq: son and heir apparent of William Lenthall late of Burford aforesaid Esq: deceased who was son and heir of J. John Lenthall Knt and Dame Mary his wife deceased who was one of the daughters and co-heiresses of John Blund Esq: also deceased of his own part and Robert Stoune of Ban within the Parish of Chipping in the County of Somerton & Yeoman of the other part **Witnesseth** that the said John Lenthall his son party to these presents for and in

consideration of the sum of five shillings of lawful money of Great Britain unto him in hand paid by the said Robert Stoune before the sealing and delivery hereof the payment and receipt whereof is made by the said John Lenthall and by these presents doth Bargain and sell unto the said Robert Stoune All that one full fourth part of the whole in severer partes to be divided of all that messuage or tenement commonly called or known by the name of Ban belonging to or parte and partes of the Manor of Chipping aforesaid and of one full fourth parte of the whole in severer partes to be divided of all houses Barnes stables Buildinges gardens orchards yards meadowes pastured profits trees Woods underwoods commodities ways paths passages waters watercourses commones commones of pasture and advantages whatsoever therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining or to or with the same commonly used occupied demised or enjoyed or reputed taken or knowne as parte partes or member thereof now in the possession of him the said Robert Stoune his assignee or assignees untrited situated lying and being in the Parish of Chipping aforesaid and the Revertion and Reversioner Remainer and Remainers Rents yelds and profits of all and singular the said premises to have and to hold the said fourth parte of the whole in severer partes to be divided of the said messuage or tenement and all and singular other the premises with the appurtenances unto the said Robert Stoune his son and assignee from thence forth for and during the full time and term of one whole year next and immediately ensuing fully to be complete expired and ended **Yielding** and paying therefore at the end of the said term unto the said John Lenthall his son party to these presents his heirs or assignees the sum of one Pepper Corn and the same to be lawfully demanded to be held only for intent and purpose hereby vertue of these presents and of the statute made for transferring of fees into pecunie the said Robert Stoune may be in the chancery possession of the said fourth parte of the said messuage or tenement and promised with the appurtenances and may be thereby enabled to accept and take a Release or Grant of the Revertion and Reversioner to him the said Robert Stoune his heirs and assignees to the use and behoof of him the said Robert Stoune his heirs and assignees for ever **Enwitnesse** whereof the parties to these pres-
