the County of Somersett Husbandman, do owe and am
indebted unto William Hill Junr of y^e Parish of Chipstall
in y^e County aforesd^d Yeoman the full & just Sum
of Forty Pounds of Good & Lawfull money of Great
Brittain to be paid unto y^e said Will^m Hill or his Heirs
Execut^r. Administrat^r. or assigns or Lawfull attorney
unto the which paym^t. well and truly to be made
I Bind my Execut^r. Administrat^r. or either of them firmly
by these presents In Witness whereof I have here unto
Sett my hand and Seal, this Sixth Day of August
Anno: Domini 1724

Obligation, that if the above bounden Will^m Hoggood Mary
his Wife, doe from the Day of the Date hereof keep y^e peace
of King George & his Successors, against the Body
of Will^m Hill y^e Elder & Will^m Hill y^e Younger, nor Commit
nor willfull crosses or seek any Revange in word or deed
a gainst y^e House or Houses goods or names of y^e said
Will^m Hill y^e Elder or Will^m Hill y^e Younger nor make nor
Information or Complaint to any Person or Persons whatsoever
against the said Will^m Hill y^e Elder or Will^m Hill y^e Younger
their Execut^r. Administrat^r. or either of their Heirs, nor
instruct nor persuade any Person to doe y^e same, (conspiring
the Kings Game or fishing, nor for hauling or carrying
any guns nets or other Injurious whatsoever that y^e this
obligation to be void & of no effect or else to Remaine
in full power force & vertue.
