Jan. 5th 1727

In the Name of God Amen; I Charles Stone of ^{the} Parish of
Colcham in the County of Devon yeoman, being ⁱⁿ a weak
body but in sound and perfect Memory thanks be given unto
Almighty God for the same, doo make this my Last Will and Testament
in manner and form following

In first I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God
my Creator and Redeemer, and my Body to Christian Buriall
according to the Discretion of my Executors.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Stone one shilling
All the Rest of my goods and Chattels, ~~to my son~~ I doo
give and bequeath unto my son William Stone whom I doo
heroby make Constitute and appeynt to be my whole and sole
Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, In Witness
whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this twenty
first day of January Anno: Domini: 1727
