give the horse two or three pipe full of tobacco in some oats and it will help him or drinck him with it in some beer

take Olysafovia & having dissolved it in vinegar warm it upon a chafin dish of coles and with round balls of Dow stuff it hard into the horses Ears and see give him up for 24 hours, then give him a comfortable drinke
