# Articles of Agreement had made and concluded the first — — — day of November anno domini 1728 betweene Ralph Etwall of Woburn in the County of Bedford for and on the part and behalfe of the de<sup>t</sup> b'ble John Lord Viscount Lynnington of the one part and Elizabeth Stone of Chipstable in the County of Somerset widow — — — — — of the other part

In p[re]m[is] The said Ralph Etwall in pursuance of a power to be given by the said John Lord Vis[it] Lynnington in Consideration of the summe of forty shillings pounds to him in hand paid by the said Elizabeth Stone — and Ninety eight pounds more to be paid unto the said John Lord Vis[it] Lynnington in manner hereinafter expressed doth — Covenant promise and grant to and with the said Elizabeth Stone — his executors admo[ns] and assignees that at the cost and charge in the Law of the said Elizabeth Stone — the said John Lord Vis[it] Lynnington shall and will on or before the first — day of May — next ensuing be good and sufficient Conveyanted and — assured in the Law grant and Convey unto the said Elizabeth Stone — his executors admo[ns] and assignees a clear and absolute estate in fee simple of and in a fourth part purparty and portion (the whole in four parts to be divided) of All that messuage or tenement with the appurtenances — & all v[er]m[er]ritual lying and being in the parish and manor of Chipstable aforesd now in the tenure or occupation of the said Elizabeth Stone free from all Incumbrances ( Except an Estate by Sease determinable on the death of William Stone formerly granted of the premises) — — — — —

And the said Elizabeth Stone — for furthering the said executors admo[ns] and assignees doth Covenant promise — and agree to and with the said Ralph Etwall his executors admo[ns] and assignees that in Consideration of such estate in fee simple of the premises — the said Elizabeth Stone — his executors admo[ns] and assignees shall and will well and truly pay unto the said John Lord Vis[it] Lynnington his executors admo[ns] and assignees the full summe of Ninety eight pounds — — — of old British money on or before the said first — — — day of May — — next ensuing on the perfecting the conveyances of the premises **In witnessse** whereof the said parties to these presents have interchangably set their hands and sealed the day and year first above written
